## **Summer Institute 2018**

The Sherwood School District offers a summer program for all students. A variety of classes are offered, taught by the district's teaching staff. Following is a description of classes.

Sherwood School district offers academic and transition classes in the summer through the Summer Institute. Classes range from one to three weeks. Classes will be held at Edy Ridge Elementary and Laurel Ridge Middle School.

The sessions are as follows:

**Skill Building Classes** are 3 weeks long and are designed to support basic skills in reading, writing and mathematics.

**Transition Classes** provide support for students as they move from one academic level to another.

### **Class Cost**

The cost for each class is determined by adding the tuition base-rate and required supply fees. Class costs are listed with course descriptions.

### **Registration**

## COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

### **Skill Building Classes**

Skill Building Classes offer an opportunity for students to get academic support in a smaller class setting. Although no grades will be given for these classes, teachers will give parents feedback on their child's progress. Students are encouraged to bring a small snack to class (***peanut free only please***). Classes will take a brief snack/recess break.

### **First Grade Prep**

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-6**

First grade prep is designed to strengthen the skills of incoming first grade students. The academic focus is on reviewing major concepts that were taught during the kindergarten year. Students will receive instruction in Math (number writing, number sense, patterning, and counting), Reading (phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, and comprehension), and Writing (letter formation, capitalization, punctuation, and ideas). This class is for incoming first grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### **Reading—Grade 1**

**10:15 am - 12:15 pm**

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-7**

This class will emphasize strengthening reading and writing skills. Incoming first graders will review sounds, improve their decoding skills, and increase their fluency in reading and writing. Students will participate in phonemic awareness activities, sight word acquisition, and purposeful reading comprehension discussion. There will be many fun activities designed to keep students interested. This class is for incoming first grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### **Reading—Grade 2**

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-4**

This class will emphasize strengthening reading skills in a small group setting. Incoming second graders will work on reading comprehension, reading fluency, decoding skills, and sight word acquisition. There will be many fun activities including Readers Theatre. This class is for incoming second grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Reading—Grade 3

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-26**

This class will emphasize skills to strengthen reading and writing. Incoming third-graders will review sounds and strengthen their decoding skills, as well as build their reading fluency, by selecting interesting, non-fiction passages at reading levels best suited for their development. Students will listen to recordings of passages to help them reach their goal rate. Building comprehension will be coupled with strengthening written language skills, using a variety of fun activities. This class is for incoming third grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Reading—Grades 4 - 5

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-31**

Students in this class will build their reading fluency by selecting interesting, non-fiction passages at reading levels best suited for their development. Building comprehension will be coupled with strengthening written language skills using a variety of fun activities. This class is for incoming fourth & fifth grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Math—Grades 2 - 3

**Instructor: Amanda Rausch**

**10:15 am - 12:15 pm**

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-26**

This class will include a review of basic math facts, counting, place value, column addition and subtraction, basic computation skills and problem solving. Students will also review everyday math skills such as time, money, and measurement. It will include independent and group work, investigations, games, and other fun hands-on activities to reinforce math skills. This class is for incoming second & third grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Math Grades 4 - 5

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Edy Ridge Room E-31**

Students will focus on the big mathematical topics in fourth and fifth grade: multiplication, division, fractions, decimals, area, surface area, and volume. These topics will be approached through independent and group work, as well as fun hands-on activities. Students participating should increase their fluency with math facts, improve their problem solving and real life math skills, and feel more competent as mathematicians. This class is for incoming fourth and fifth grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Language Arts—Grades 6 - 8

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Laurel Ridge Room M-8**

The primary focus of this class will be to develop Language Arts skills through high-interest texts. Students will read and analyze a variety of texts utilizing key comprehension skills. Additionally, they will view texts through the lens of a writer, noting the way the author crafts the piece to engage the reader and suit the purpose of the piece. Students will implement features from the exemplar texts into their own writing, creating several portfolio pieces. This class is for incoming sixth, seventh and eighth grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

### Math—Grades 6 - 8

**Instructor: Kinley Lally**

**10:15 am - 12:15 pm**

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Laurel Ridge Room M-8**

Sixth grade students will review key Common Core skills such as: place value, multiplication, division, adding and subtracting fractions and decimals, perimeter, volume, and surface area. Seventh and eighth grade students will review order of operations, evaluating, simplifying expressions, solving equations, and graphing. Students will practice critical thinking and problem solving skills as well as participate in fun hands-on activities to become more independent mathematicians. This class is for incoming sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. **Class Cost: \$150.00**

## Math—Grades 9

**3 WEEKS - Mon - Thurs (June 25, 2018 – July 19, 2018 No classes will be held July 2-6)**

**Location: Laurel Ridge Room M-9**

Foundations for High School Algebra - Students will review key Common Core skills and practice critical thinking and problem solving strategies. Additionally, the class will focus on the foundations and concepts of high school algebra to help prepare them for a successful year in math. This class is for incoming ninth grade students.

**If students do not attend class, they will lose access to OdysseyWare.**

**Location: Laurel Ridge Middle School (Media Center)**

OdysseyWare is a computer based, self-paced proficiency program through which students can earn high school credit. Students attend classes and will receive support from a Sherwood High School Teacher. A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory until the course is completed.

Students pay only one time per session and can complete multiple courses over the span of Summer Institute. Students must finish all courses within the four week summer program, as they will not be allowed to continue on OdysseyWare after July 19th or in September when the 2018-19 school year starts. *Please contact your son or daughter's counselor for more information regarding courses needed for credit recovery or credit advancement in Health.*
